“Ons vind mnr Trevor Manuel se Facebook-uitnodiging aan Suid-Afrikaners om ‘n mening oor nasiebou uit te spreek, pikant teen die agtergrond dat adjunk-president Kgalema Motlanthe pas in New York ‘n dik rooi streep daardeur getrek het,” sê ds. “We find Mr. Trevor Manuel’s Facebook invitation to South Africans to express opinions on nation building absurd against the back ground of Pres. Kgalema Motlanthe, drawing a thick, red line through this during his visit to New York,” says Christian Democratic Party (CDP) leader Theunis Botha.

“Manuel and his planning commission can have the best intentions in the world, but as long as the government persist with its racist driven agenda by which some South Africans are reduced to second class citizens, the aim of nation building is a futile exercise.

Are they going to continue to play racial music which sounds sweet to some supporters, but makes a cacophonous noise to other South Africans with no hope of harmonising which is required for nation building.”
