CDP reacts to Mr. Gay World pageant in SA

“Is there no limit to South Africa’s arrogance as they go out of their way to provoke God?” asks Rev Theunis Botha, leader of the Christian Democratic Party (CDP). “Added to Zuma’s continuous references to ancestral worship and animistic practices we also have homosexuals continuing to test the bounds. Not content with their life style being tolerated and even protected and advanced by the South African Constitution they are intent on turning South Africa into the gay capital of Africa if not the world.

“They have succeeded in turning the Holy Sacrament of marriage into an unholy ‘joining together’ of a man with a man or a woman with a woman. They have romped around the streets of South Africa during their gay parades exposing themselves in public in an act of defiance of common decency. They have made blasphemous films which they show during their film festivals stating that our Lord Jesus Christ, Himself was a homosexual. Gay-parade in Suid-Afrika aangebied op dieselfde dag as wat Christene dwars oor die wêreld die opstanding van Jesus gedenk het. Opmerklik, met die uitsondering van Namibië en Ethiopië was daar geen deelnemers uit ander Afrikalande as Suid-Afrika nie.

“Suid-Afrika het onlangs sy voorsitterskap van die VN-veiligheidsraad gebruik om ‘n debat oor gay-regte te voer, en terselfdertyd druk op ander Afrikalande uitgeoefen om nie Arabiese en Moslemlande in ‘n boikot van die debat te steun nie.
