"The Christian Democratic Party (CDP) wants to use Workers' Day to once again focus on the unacceptable unemployment crisis in the country," says CDP leader, Rev. Theunis Botha.

"We urge government to:

- properly implement the national development plan, and halt all undermining legislation such as the bill currently under consideration which promotes a licensing system, that will further stifle entrepreneurship, and thus create even more unemployment;
- halt other restraints such as cadre deployment and racial quotas that are further preventing the economy from operating at its full potential;
- stop radical union Leaders from damaging the economy by calling for nation-wide strikes in support of unrealistic wage increases. It is time the workers realise that they are being used as political footballs. How many poor or unemployed union leaders do you know?

"The CDP also urges government to seriously turn around South Africa's decline on the corruption perception index.

"Only then will workers actually have reason to celebrate Workers' Day."
