CDP welcomes Breytenbach-finding

The Christian Democratic Party (CDP) welcomes the fact that Adv Glynnnes Breytenbach was found 'not guilty' on all fifteen charges at a disciplinary hearing.

"We call on the National Prosecuting Authority to immediately re-instate her and allow her to continue with her work.

"She was suspended for more than a year, during which time the matters she was involved in, e.g. the allegations against Richard Mdluli, and the Sishen-Kumba issue, were left unattended, to a large extent. As some of the country's most powerful politicians were implicated in these matters, the suspension of Breytenbach was questionable from the outset.

"We strongly recommend that all outstanding matters be resolved as soon as possible," says CDP leader, Rev. Theunis Botha.

CDP verwelkom Breytenbach-bevinding

Die Christen-Demokratiese Party (CDP) verwelkom die uitslag van die dissiplinêre verhoor waarin adv. Glynnis Brytenbach op al 15 aanklagte teen haar onskuldig bevind is.

"Ons doen 'n beroep op die Nasionale Vervolgingsgesag om haar onverwyld toe te laat om met haar werk voort te gaan.

"Sy was meer as n jaar geskors, en in hierdie tyd het die sake waarby sy betrokke was tot 'n groot mate in die lug bly hang., soos die bewerings wat teen Richard Mdluli gemaak is en die Sishen – Kumba-aangeleentheid.

"Aangesien van die land se mees prominente politici by beide sake geïmpliseer is, was Breytenbach se skorsing van die begin af onder verdenking van bymotiewe.

"Ons doen 'n beroep daarop dat alle uitstaande sake so goue as mooinlik opgeklaar word," aldus. Theunis Botha, leier van die CDP.
