E-Toll - get rid of ignorant (and lying) ministers

After months and months of concerted public opposition to the e-toll system and a pending court hearing, the ANC government has decided to ride rough shod over public opinion and to arrogantly announce that it intends to go ahead with its implementation.

“On top of this the transport minister announces ‘lower’ e-tariffs which turns out to be exactly the same as those previously announced,” says Rev. Theunis Botha, leader of the Christian Democratic Party (CDP).

“Shortly before reading his mid-term budget, Finance minister Pravin Gordhan lashed out at the media and others stating that they were foul mouthing South Africa and negatively affecting investment possibilities. But what about his cabinet colleagues who contribute to the perception of South Africa as a Mickey Mouse state?”

“Recently the minister of minerals said she did not know of the existence of AMCU until after the Marikana tragedy. It appears that it slipped her mind, that she herself shortly before a meeting with AMCU actually cancelled the meeting. It is unbelievable that a minister responsible for mining should not have taken note of the role AMCU played in the Implats strike at the beginning of the year, which sent the platinum price soaring.

“How on earth could Gordhan expect of South Africans, to be proud of ministers who continue to embarrass them? The list is long, such as the school book crisis and hospitals and clinics in disarray – to name but a few. A fish rots from the head.

“The remedy is quite simple, get a smaller cabinet with good ministers and good advisors. To blame the media and public is not the way to go.”
