**Obama's new investor-plans: ANC must take note says CDP**

"We urge all countries, including South Africa, seeking investment and development aid from abroad, to take note of the new criteria set by Pres. Barack Obama.

"This boils down to conditions such as sustained democracy and taking corruption to task. Assistance will be in the form of economic development, rather than food and medicine aid," says Rev. Theunis Botha, leader of the Christian Democratic Party (CDP). "This attitude is also related to the approach followed by the European Union, and it appears as though practices where donor countries simply dump funding in bottomless pits and often ending up in the wrong hands, will soon be over for ever."

"This is also 'n clear message to the ANC that there will be no sympathy to a selective approach – as was also pointed out by Tony Yengeni – towards corruption, and that the cadre deployment policy flings in the face of what donor and investor countries regard as suitable governance."

"Ons moedig alle lande – ook Suid-Afrika – wat lippe aflek vir beleggings en ontwikkelingshulp uit die buiteland, om kennis te neem van nuwe kriteria hiervoor wat deur pres. Barack Obama bekend gestel is."

"Dit kom daarop neer dat lande hul demokrasieë volhoubaar moet bedryf, en korrupsie behoorlik moet vasvat. Hulp sal in die vorm van ekonomiese ontwikkeling eerder as voedsel- en medisynehulp wees," sê ds. Theunis Botha, leier van die Christen-Demokratiese Party (CDP). "Die benadering kom baie ooreen met dié van die Europese Unie, en dit lyk of die era waar skenkerland bloot hulp in bodemlose putte gestort, en dit in die verkeerde hande beland het, vir goed nek omgedraai word."

"Dit is ook 'n duidelike boodskap aan die ANC dat daar geen simpatie met 'n selektiewe proses – in die woorde van Tony Yengeni – teenoor korrupsie sal wees nie, en dat die ANC se kaderonplooingsbeleid teenstrydig is met dit wat beleggerslande as aanvaarbare staatsbestuur beskou.
